**Hera - Queen of the Gods**

Hera is the queen of the gods and the goddess of marriage, family, and women. As the wife of Zeus, she rules Mount Olympus with great authority. Her sacred animals include the peacock, known for its colorful feathers, and the cow. She is often depicted holding a royal sceptre.



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**Demeter - Goddess of the Harvest**

Demeter is the goddess of agriculture, harvest, grain, and the fertility of the earth. She is responsible for the growth of crops and the changing of seasons. Her symbols include wheat stalks, torches, and the cornucopia (horn of plenty) overflowing with fresh fruits and grain.





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**Aphrodite - Goddess of Love & Beauty**

Aphrodite is the goddess of love, beauty, pleasure, and eternal youth. According to legend, she was born from the foam of the sea and floated ashore on a giant scallop shell. Her sacred symbols include the dove, swan, rose, and apple.



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**Hestia - Goddess of the Hearth**

Hestia is the gentle goddess of the hearth, home, and family. She is responsible for keeping the sacred fire of Mount Olympus burning. Unlike other gods, Hestia chose peace and avoided conflict. Her symbols are the hearth fire and the kettle.





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**Persephone - Goddess of Spring**

Persephone is the goddess of spring growth and the queen of the Underworld. As the daughter of Demeter, her return to Olympus brings spring flowers and warm weather, while her return to the Underworld brings winter. Her symbols include flowers and the pomegranate.



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**Iris - Goddess of the Rainbow**

Iris is the winged messenger of the gods and the goddess of the rainbow. She uses the rainbow to travel between Olympus and Earth to deliver important messages. She is often shown carrying a pitcher of water from the River Styx and wearing a colorful gown.
